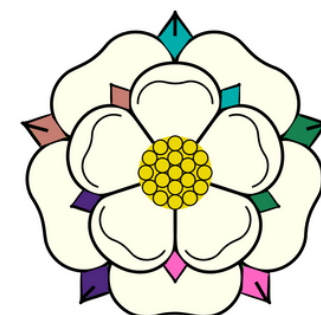

# About the West Yorkshire Pathfinder Partnership



The West Yorkshire Pathfinder Partnership (WYPP) is initially a 12-month pilot programme, launched following the success of the programme in other areas across the UK. West Yorkshire is the largest area to test the model, involving multiple court sites and local authorities.

Led by Staying Put, WYPP is a collaboration between 5 exceptional domestic abuse services in the area; Leeds Domestic Violence Service, represented by Leeds Women's Aid and Behind Closed Doors, WomenCentre, Pennine Domestic Abuse Partnership and Wakefield Domestic Abuse Service.

The WYPP will deliver a Family Court IDVA service for individuals, families and children going through the Family Court process. Pathfinder aims to improve the court experience and outcomes for children and families by centring the voice of the child, by bringing all agencies involved in family justice together in a resolution-focussed way and providing an enhanced array of support for those who have experienced domestic abuse.

# Key Aims of the Pathfinder Model

- Improved user experience –  
by centring the voice of the child in the proceedings in a Child Impact Report and improved support for victims and children of domestic abuse.
- Improved the co-ordination between agencies –  
enhanced risk assessment and greater co-ordination.
- Efficiencies in the court process –  
court appointed Case Progression Officers will help to prepare parties for the court process and track compliance and hearings.
- Reduction of re-traumatisation of victims –  
improved risk assessment and greater use of IDVAs as well as fewer hearings, means a reduction in the number of times victims must tell their stories, reducing re-traumatisation.
- Reduction in returning cases –  
improved understanding of cases leading to more sustainable court orders.

# About the role

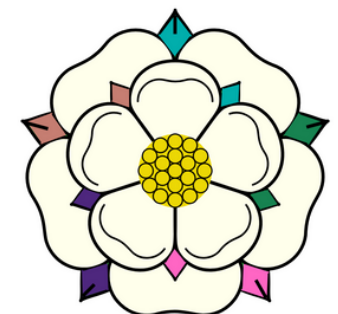
The role of the Family Court Domestic Abuse Support Worker (DASW) will, although based at Staying Put's head office in Bradford, work across the partnership to deliver a seamless pathway for referrals from local authorities and external partners. The role is responsible for the day-to-day running of the administration function of the WYPP and will involve responding to enquiries and providing advice, support and guidance to those waiting to access service support.

There may be a need to support the wider team with providing emotional support and initial assessment for risk and needs to individuals going through the family court process.

The role will maintain positive working relationships with wider stakeholders of the Pathfinder programme and ensure clear communication of processes.

The role is initially a 12-month contract with the possibility of extension, depending on positive outcomes of the pilot.

Our ideal candidate will be organised, process driven and able to work with strong attention to detail. They will have experience of partnership working with the ability to build and maintain positive working relationships. 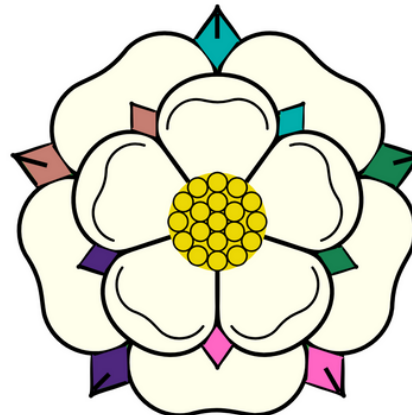
